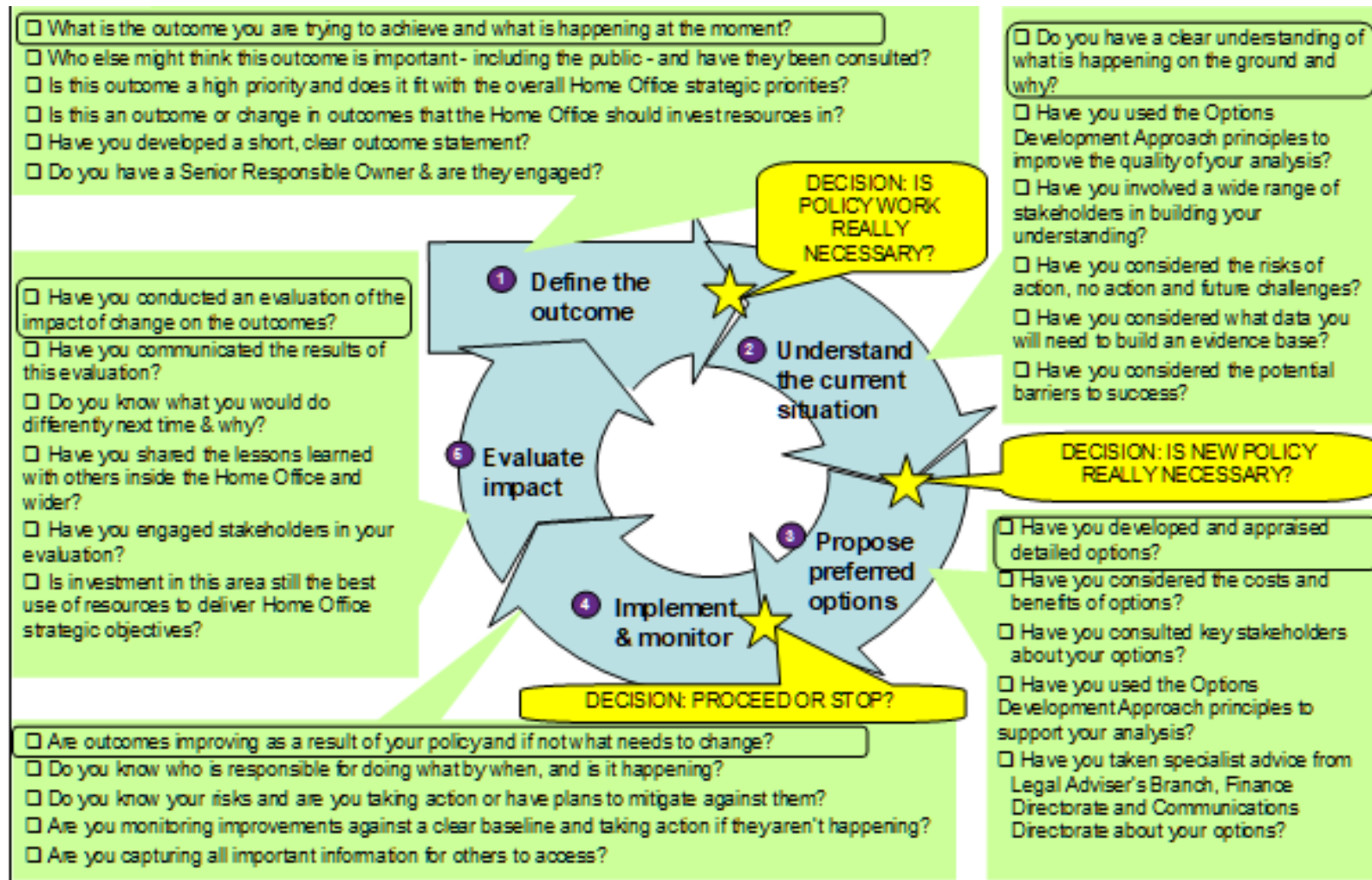

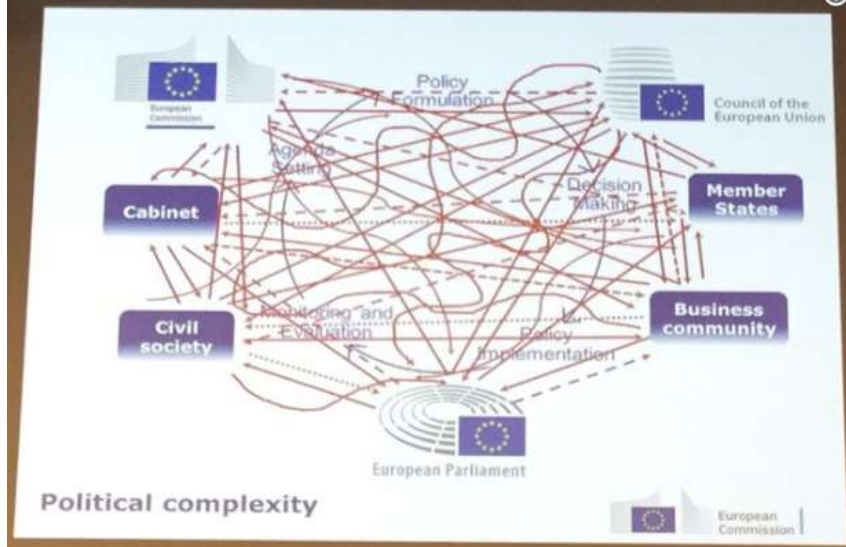
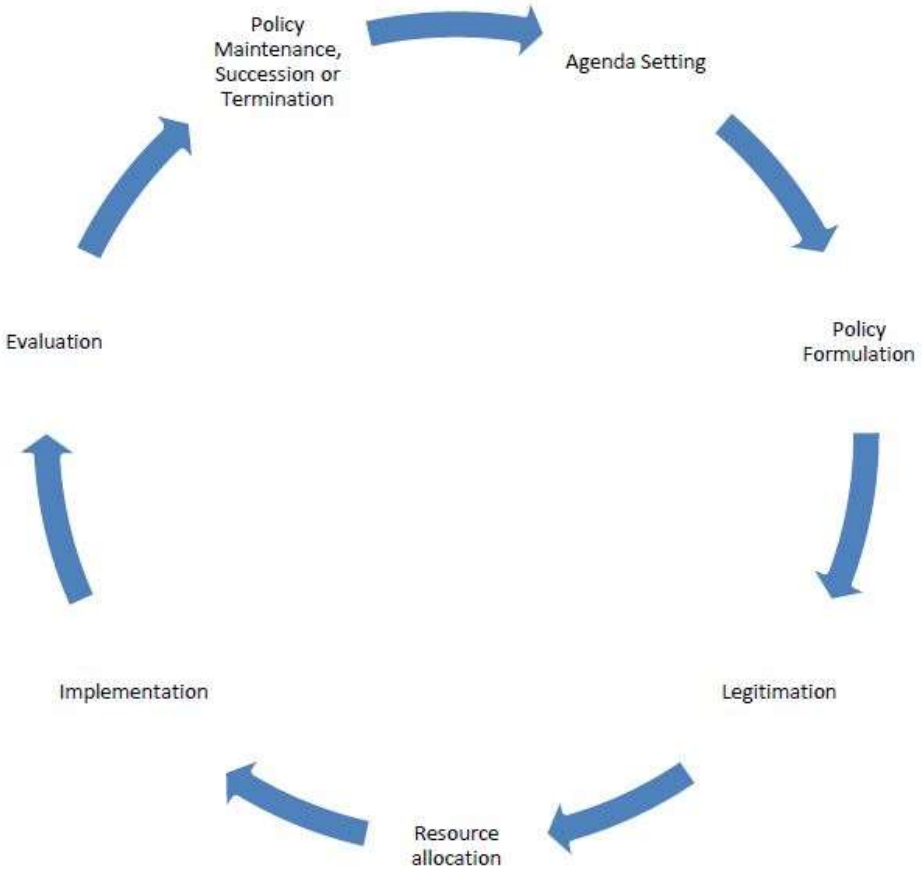
Variants on the policy cycle: we consult a lot

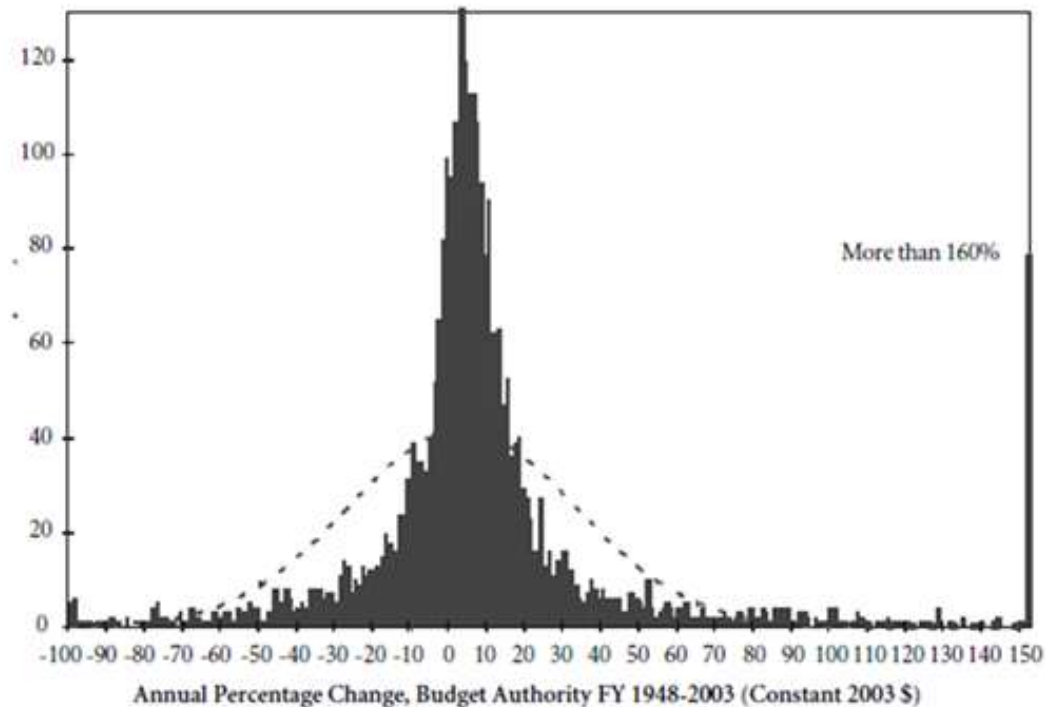
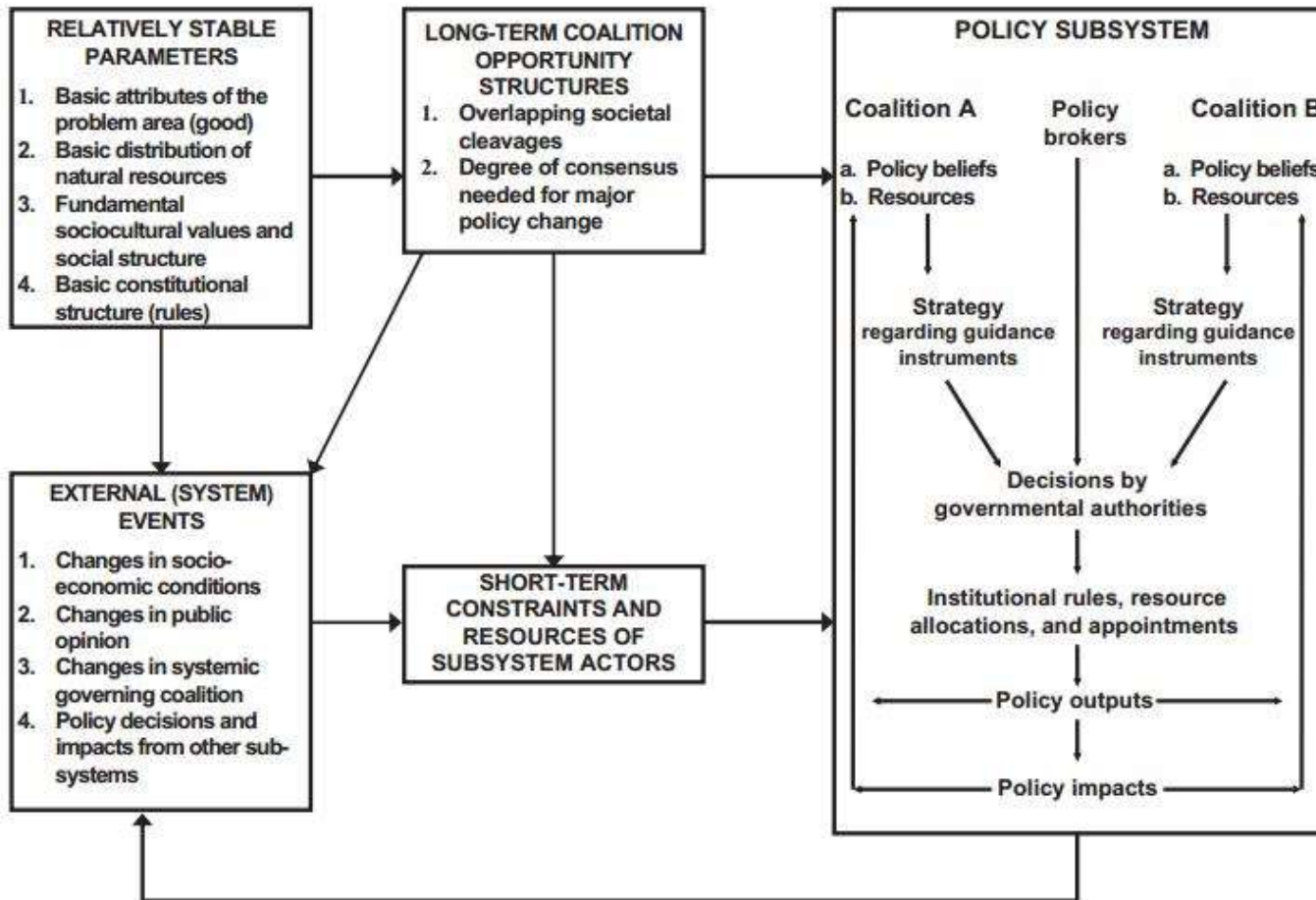


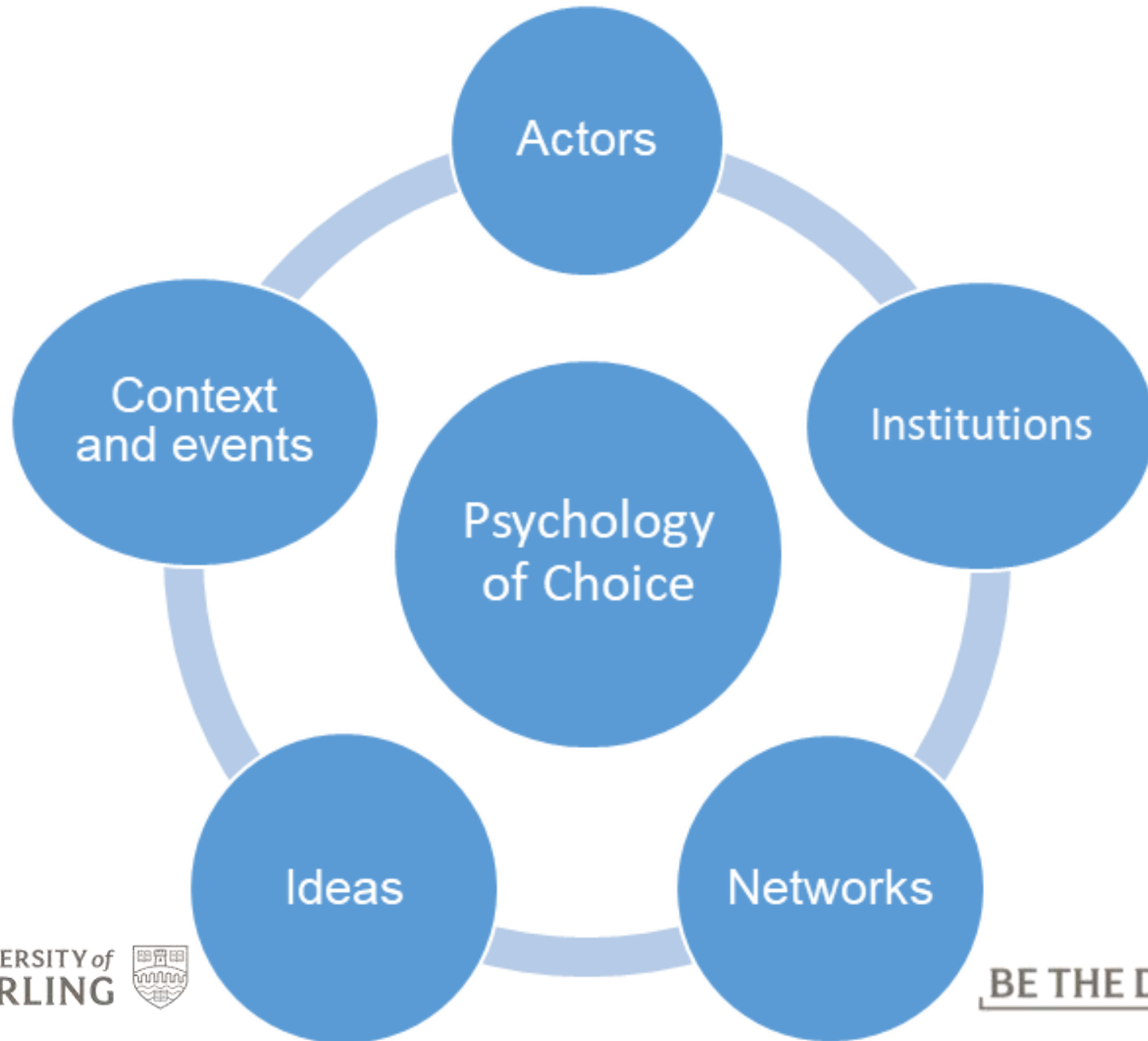
FIGURE 6.2 Annual Percentage Change in U.S. Budget Authority for Office of Management and Budget Programmatic Subfunctions, FY 1947 through FY 2003

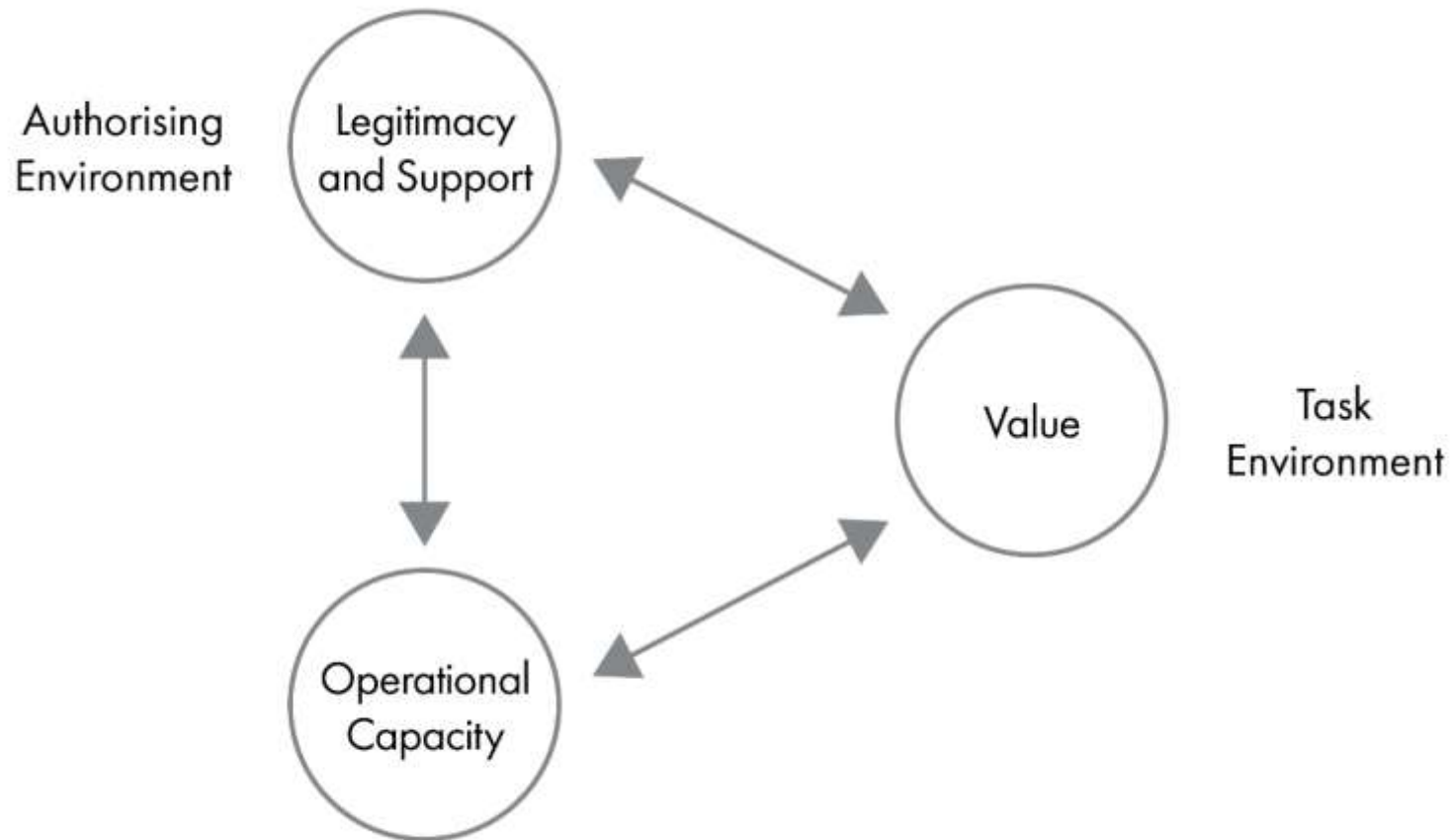

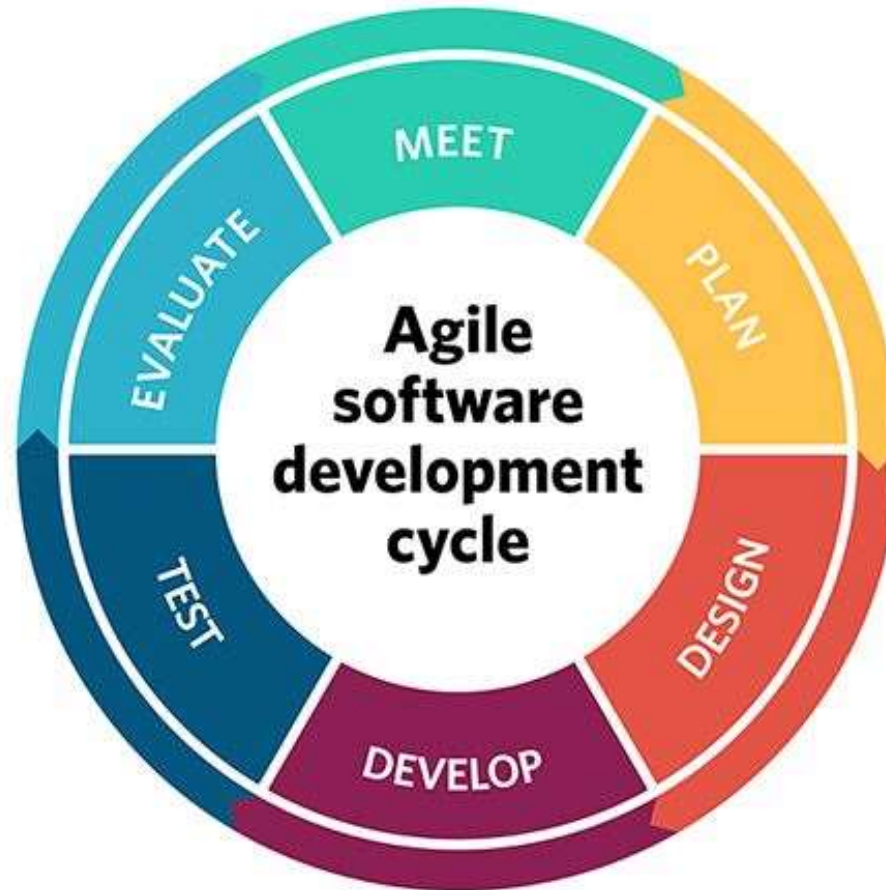
